



Taking Care Of Your New Furniture

An expert guide on how to keep your furniture looking its best

| Sunlight and Heating



- Our tables are not fond of direct sunlight, so please keep them away from harsh sunlight or excessive heat.
- Solid wood tables, like Oak and Pine, placed on underfloor heating or in conservatories will not be included in our warranty policy.

| Outdoor Furniture



- We recommend that you store your outdoor furniture during the colder months or when it's not in use. This practice will help extend the lifespan of your furniture.
- Customers are required to perform annual maintenance on all outdoor furniture, including applying the appropriate protective treatments.
- Bespoke outdoor wooden tables come pre-oiled with an exterior oil as standard that offers UV protection.

| Table Maintenance



The customer is responsible for looking after their table's maintenance and to take the necessary measures to preserve its appearance.

Cleaning Your Tabletop



We recommend that you do NOT use highly concentrated chemical cleaners or protection sprays on your table as this may sit on top of the oil protection layer if you or ourselves have applied one. They could cause the product to build up and make your tables surface sticky, voiding the tables' warranty.

Cleaning Tip: Use warm soapy water with a soft sponge or cloth. Make sure to completely dry the table off with a dry cloth straightaway



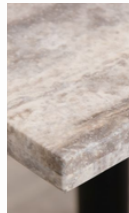
Reclaimed Tables

- We do not add any oil or protective coatings to Reclaimed Tables, in order to maintain the natural character of the table top.



Zinc and Copper Tables

- You may notice wear and tear, including scratches. To minimize this we advise using coasters and placemats for any glasses and plates. Applying a lacquer spray can help provide some protection, however, scratches may still occur with extensive frequent use.
- Avoid using chemical cleaners or any substances that could spill, such as lemon juice, on the table.



Travertine Top Tables

- We suggest applying a stone sealer to the surface of your table. For optimal protection, spread a thin layer and allow it to dry before use. This process is recommended every 3-6 months. However, in commercial settings we recommend this is completed once a month.

Table Staining



If we have applied a table stain to your table top, the stain we use is Van Dyck Crystals. This is a traditional and natural water-based wood dye made from walnut husks.

Oil Protection



- For added protection, we can protect your table with an Osmo Oil. This will be for an additional charge. For more details, please refer to the product description on our website or contact our Sales team for assistance.
- We offer three varieties of Osmo Oil: these are Satin 3032, Clear 3062 and Raw Matt 3044.
- It's essential to reapply Osmo Oil when your table surface begins to show signs of wear. When doing so, ensure that you use the same type and colour of oil that matches your table's original finish, if applicable.
- To apply, we recommend starting with the underside of your table to ensure you're satisfied with the finish, as this can create a slight colour variation. Clean the table thoroughly with a soft sponge and warm water, and allow the surface to dry completely according to our cleaning guidelines.
- Apply a small amount of oil onto a new, clean, and dry sponge, working in the direction of the grain. Allow the thin coat of oil to dry overnight before using the table.
